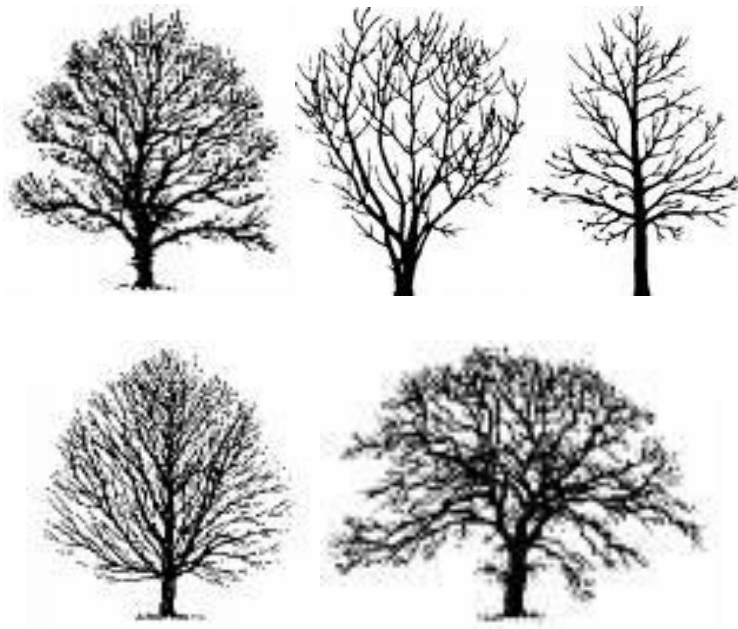















## TREE DESCRIPTIONS

<p align="center">AA</p> 	<p><b>Royal Red Maple</b> Larger tree, 3-4 years additional growth 1.4" diameter \$85</p>	<p><b>Zone:</b> 4 / <b>Height:</b> 40' / <b>Spread:</b> 35' / <b>Shape:</b> Oval to rounded <b>Summer Foliage:</b> Burgundy / <b>Fall Foliage:</b> Maroon/reddish bronze A great accent tree. Similar to Crimson King but faster growing (15-20"/year). Holds its colour all season. <b>Soils:</b> sand to clay. Withstands hot dry conditions better than sugar maples. Lives 60-80 years. Shallow wide root system. High wildlife value.</p>
<p align="center">BB</p> 	<p><b>Armstrong Red Maple</b> Larger tree, 4 years additional growth 1.6" diameter \$90</p>	<p><b>Zone:</b> 4 / <b>Height:</b> 45' / <b>Spread:</b> 25' / <b>Shape:</b> Upright <b>Summer Foliage:</b> Vibrant red in spring, turning dark green <b>Fall Foliage:</b> Orange to orange red One of the best red maples. Transplants easily. Accepts very poor to good drainage. Light grey bark. High wildlife value. Grows 12-20" per year. Lives 60-90 years.</p>
<p align="center">CC</p> 	<p><b>Red Sunset Maple</b> Larger tree, 3-4 years additional growth 1.4" diameter \$85</p>	<p><b>Zone:</b> 4 / <b>Height:</b> 60' / <b>Spread:</b> 40' / <b>Shape:</b> Upright dense <b>Summer Foliage:</b> Dark green / <b>Fall Foliage:</b> Red and orange One of the best red maples. Vigorous tree with upright, dense growth habit. Strong symmetrical branching. Brilliant red-orange leaves last well into the fall. <b>Soils:</b> coarse sand to silty clay, very poor to well drained. Grows 12-20"/year. Lives 60-90 years. High wildlife value.</p>
<p align="center">DD</p> 	<p><b>Ballerina Serviceberry</b> Larger tree, 3-4 years additional growth 8.5' tree \$85</p>	<p><b>Zone:</b> 4 / <b>Height:</b> 16' / <b>Spread:</b> 13' / <b>Shape:</b> Upright spreading <b>Summer Foliage:</b> Green / <b>Fall Foliage:</b> Orange and red <b>Flower:</b> White / <b>Fruit:</b> Reddish Upright small tree with spreading branches. Fruit is readily consumed by birds in the fall.</p>
<p align="center">EE</p> 	<p><b>English Oak</b> Larger tree, 3-4 years additional growth 1.4" diameter \$90</p>	<p><b>Zone:</b> 4 / <b>Height:</b> 60' / <b>Spread:</b> 45' / <b>Shape:</b> Broad rounded <b>Summer Foliage:</b> Deep glossy green / <b>Fall Foliage:</b> Yellow brown Majestic tree. Transplants easily. Fast growing, adapts well to many locations, very hardy, leaves remain through winter. <b>Soils:</b> sand to clay, moderately to well drained. Withstands some shade but not flooding. Prefers moist but tolerates dry soils. Grows 12"/year. Lives 200-300 years. Acorns attract birds, small animals and browsers.</p>
<p align="center">FF</p> 	<p><b>Shubert Cherry</b> Larger tree, 2-3 years additional growth 1.4" diameter \$80</p>	<p><b>Zone:</b> 2 / <b>Height:</b> 16' / <b>Spread:</b> 13' / <b>Shape:</b> Oval <b>Summer Foliage:</b> Maroon red / <b>Fall Foliage:</b> Scarlet red <b>Flower:</b> White Extremely hardy small tree with foliage that starts out green and changes to purple as it matures.</p>
<p align="center">GG</p> 	<p><b>Greenspire Linden</b> Larger tree, 3-4 years additional growth 1.4" diameter \$75</p>	<p><b>Zone:</b> 3 / <b>Height:</b> 50' / <b>Spread:</b> 35' / <b>Shape:</b> Symmetrical pyramid <b>Summer Foliage:</b> Deep green / <b>Fall Foliage:</b> Yellow Excellent shade tree, small leaves, nice branching habit, rapid growing, retains its form as it grows. <b>Soils:</b> sand to clay, does well in difficult and/or moist conditions.</p>

<p>A</p> 	<p><b>Green Mountain Sugar Maple</b> 6.5' - 7.5' tree \$60</p>	<p><b>Zone: 4 / Height: 70' / Spread: 40' / Shape: Broad oval</b> <b>Summer Foliage:</b> Dark green leathery / <b>Fall Foliage:</b> Reddish orange to orange / <b>Flower:</b> Greenish yellow Very good sugar maple, good fall colour. <b>Soils:</b> some sand to clay loam, normal to moist conditions. Part shade to sun.</p>
<p>B</p> 	<p><b>Fall Fiesta Sugar Maple</b> 6.5' - 7.5' tree \$60</p>	<p><b>Zone: 4 / Height: 65' / Spread: 40' / Shape: Broad oval</b> <b>Summer Foliage:</b> Glossy green / <b>Fall Foliage:</b> Red / <b>Flower:</b> Orange Cross between red and silver maple. Excellent long-lasting fall colour. Transplants readily. Resistant to sun scalding and frost cracks. Tolerates drought, clay soil and urban conditions.</p>
<p>C</p> 	<p><b>Silver Queen Silver Maple</b> 7.5' - 8.5' branched whip \$45</p>	<p><b>Zone: 3 / Height: 50' / Spread: 40' / Shape: Oval</b> <b>Summer Foliage:</b> Medium green above, silver below / <b>Fall Foliage:</b> Yellow Very good ornamental tree. Native sugar maple. White underside of leaves gives appearance of changing colours in a breeze. <b>Soils:</b> mostly sand to clay. Accepts dry to moist conditions, part shade to full sun.</p>
<p>D</p> 	<p><b>Royal Red Maple</b> 7.5' - 8.5' tree \$65</p>	<p><b>Zone: 4 / Height: 35' / Spread: 30' / Shape: Oval to rounded</b> <b>Summer Foliage:</b> Burgundy / <b>Fall Foliage:</b> Maroon/reddish bronze A great accent tree. Similar to Crimson King but faster growing (15-20"/year). Holds its colour all season. <b>Soils:</b> sand to clay. Withstands hot dry conditions better than sugar maples. Lives 60-80 years. Shallow wide root system. High wildlife value.</p>
<p>E</p> 	<p><b>Heritage River Birch</b> 9'-10' multi-stem tree \$70</p>	<p><b>Zone: 4 / Height: 45' / Spread: 35' / Shape: Broadly pyramidal</b> <b>Summer Foliage:</b> Medium to dark green / <b>Fall Foliage:</b> Yellow Beautiful white bark, exfoliating as it matures. Resistant to Birch Borer. <b>Soils:</b> coarse sand to heavy clay, poor to moderate drainage; prefers wet to average moisture but survives dry summers. Grows 24"/year. Matures in 50 years. Good nesting tree. Catkins attract birds.</p>
<p>F</p> 	<p><b>Hackberry</b> 7.5' - 8.5' tree \$65</p>	<p><b>Zone: 2 / Height: 50' / Spread: 40' / Shape: Weakly pyramidal</b> <b>Summer Foliage:</b> Light green / <b>Fall Foliage:</b> Yellow Excellent tree for adverse soil conditions. Does well in dryer soil. Water well the first year.</p>
<p>G</p> 	<p><b>Russian Olive</b> 6.5' - 7.5' tree \$55</p>	<p><b>Zone: 2 / Height: 20' / Spread: 16' / Shape: Rounded</b> <b>Summer Foliage:</b> Silver grey / <b>Fall Foliage:</b> Yellow Attention-getting greyish-green foliage. Does well in dryer conditions, best in light sandy loams. Yellow flowers in June produce a sweet scent. Very hardy.</p>
<p>H</p> 	<p><b>Gingko (Maidenhair)</b> 6.5' - 7.5' tree \$75</p>	<p><b>Zone: 4 / Height: 50' / Spread: 35' / Shape: Broadly pyramidal</b> <b>Summer Foliage:</b> Yellow green / <b>Fall Foliage:</b> Yellow Fossil tree with unusual fan-shaped leaves, exceptionally disease-resistant. Prefers sandy moderately moist soil but will grow well in clay. Leaves turn a striking yellow in the fall.</p>

<p>I</p> 	<p><b>Honey Locust</b> 7.5' - 8.5' tree  \$55</p>	<p><b>Zone: 4 / Height: 30' / Spread: 25' / Shape:</b> Upright oval <b>Summer Foliage:</b> Dark green / <b>Fall Foliage:</b> Yellow Large tree with dark green composite leaves that turn yellow in the fall. Provides nice light shade.</p>
<p>J</p> 	<p><b>Dolgo Crabapple</b> 6.5' – 7.5' tree  \$55</p>	<p><b>Zone: 3 / Height: 35' / Spread: 25' / Shape:</b> Upright open <b>Summer Foliage:</b> Green / <b>Fall Foliage:</b> Yellow / <b>Flower:</b> White Glossy green foliage, white flowers and upright open habit. Well known for its bright red edible fruit. Used to make excellent crabapple jelly. <b>Soils:</b> quite adaptable, but prefers heavy loam, good drainage, full sun. Requires little pruning, but any pruning should be done before early June.</p>
<p>K</p> 	<p><b>Harvest Gold Crabapple</b> 6.5' – 7.5' tree  \$55</p>	<p><b>Zone: 3 / Height: 25' / Spread: 15' / Shape:</b> Upright <b>Summer Foliage:</b> Green / <b>Fall Foliage:</b> Yellow / <b>Flower:</b> White Long-lasting white flowers, very disease resistant. <b>Soils:</b> Moist, well-drained, acid. Prefers full sun. Golden fruit remains into late December, making this tree a show-stopper. Disease resistant.</p>
<p>L</p> 	<p><b>Madonna Crabapple</b> 5.5' – 6.5' tree  \$55</p>	<p><b>Zone: 4 / Height: 20' / Spread: 10' / Shape:</b> Upright compact <b>Summer Foliage:</b> Green / <b>Fall Foliage:</b> Yellow / <b>Flower:</b> Fragrant double white, opens early, outlasts most other crabapples. <b>Fruit:</b> Gold to red, size of a cherry. <b>Soils:</b> wide range, but prefers heavy loam, good drainage, full sun. Needs little pruning, but any pruning should be completed before early June. Good tree for smaller spaces. Excellent disease resistance.</p>
<p>M</p> 	<p><b>London Plane</b> 7.5' – 8.5' branched whip  \$55</p>	<p><b>Zone: 5 / Height: 50' / Spread: 40' / Shape:</b> Rounded <b>Summer Foliage:</b> Medium green / <b>Fall Foliage:</b> Yellow Experimental Farm has a majestic specimen planted in 1897. This variety chosen for its disease resistance. Another striking feature is the natural peeling of the bark. <b>Soils:</b> Prefers heavier clay soil. Withstands pollution and drought. Full sun or partial shade. Prickly ball-shaped fruits most noticeable in winter.</p>
<p>N</p> 	<p><b>English Oak</b> 6.5' – 7.5' tree  \$65</p>	<p><b>Zone: 4 / Height: 60' / Spread: 45' / Shape:</b> Broad oval <b>Summer Foliage:</b> Deep glossy green / <b>Fall Foliage:</b> Yellow brown Majestic tree. Transplants easily. Fast growing, adapts well to many locations, very hardy, leaves remain through winter. <b>Soils:</b> sand to clay, moderately to well drained. Withstands some shade but not flooding. Prefers moist but tolerates dry soils. Grows 12"/year. Lives 200-300 years. Acorns attract birds, small animals and browsers.</p>
<p>O</p> 	<p><b>Red Oak</b> 9' – 10' tree  \$70</p>	<p><b>Zone: 3 / Height: 60' / Spread: 50' / Shape:</b> Rounded <b>Summer Foliage:</b> Reddish, turning deep green / <b>Fall Foliage:</b> Red <b>Soils:</b> Adaptable to a range of soils, from sand to clay, moderately to well drained. Prefer moist but will tolerate dryer soils. Can withstand some shade but not flooding. Slow growing, about 12"/year. Acorns attract birds, small animals and browsers. Broad headed native tree.</p>

<p>P</p> 	<p><b>Golden Weeping Willow</b> 9' - 10' tree \$60</p>	<p><b>Zone: 4 / Height: 50' / Spread: 50' / Shape:</b> Wide, spreading <b>Summer Foliage:</b> Light green / <b>Fall Foliage:</b> Yellow One of the hardiest and most beautiful of the weeping types. Bright yellow twigs stand out during the winter. <b>Soils:</b> tolerates a wide range of soils, from some sand to some clay. Accepts normal to wet conditions, but prefers wet well-drained soil. Dappled to full sun. Requires lots of space. Very high wildlife value.</p>
<p>Q</p> 	<p><b>Ivory Silk Lilac</b> 9' - 10' tree \$75</p>	<p><b>Zone: 2 / Height: 25' / Spread: 15' / Shape:</b> Compact oval <b>Summer Foliage:</b> Dark blue green / <b>Fall Foliage:</b> Yellow <b>Flower:</b> Creamy white Outstanding ornamental tree with masses of fragrant, creamy white blossoms for 2-3 weeks in early July. Very hardy and cold-resistant. <b>Soils:</b> well-drained, fertile; can tolerate drought, blooms best in full sun. Grows 8"/year. Birds harvest seed in winter.</p>
<p>R</p> 	<p><b>Cortland Eating Apple</b> 7.5' - 8.5' tree \$45</p>	<p><b>Zone: 3 / Height: 16' / Spread: 13' / Shape:</b> Oval <b>Summer Foliage:</b> Green / <b>Fall Foliage:</b> Yellow / <b>Flower:</b> White Bright red medium-sized apple, good keeper. White flesh resists browning when cut. Good for eating, cooking, cider. Ripens late September. Partially self-fertile. <b>Soils:</b> clay loam or clay, well-drained.</p>
<p>S</p> 	<p><b>McIntosh Eating Apple</b> 7.5' - 8.5' tree \$45</p>	<p><b>Zone: 4 / Height: 16' / Spread: 13' / Shape:</b> Rounded <b>Summer Foliage:</b> Green / <b>Fall Foliage:</b> Yellow / <b>Flower:</b> White Very popular, hardy variety, excellent flavour, crisp apple with attractive cherry red skin, greenish white flesh. Good for eating and cooking. Blooms mid-season, ripens late September. <b>Soils:</b> well-drained clay loam or clay. Partially self-fertile.</p>
<p>T</p> 	<p><b>Royal Gala Eating Apple</b> 7.5' - 8.5' tree \$45</p>	<p><b>Zone: 5 / Height: 13' / Spread: 13' / Shape:</b> Oval <b>Summer Foliage:</b> Medium green / <b>Fall Foliage:</b> Yellow / <b>Flower:</b> White Medium-size apple with orange red stripes, crisp, juicy yellow flesh, sweet and aromatic, keeps 6 months. Used for eating rather than cooking. Does not bruise easily. Blooms mid-season, ripens late August. Requires pollination by another tree. <b>Soils:</b> well-drained clay loam or clay.</p>
<p>U</p> 	<p><b>Evans Sweet Eating Cherry</b> 5' - 5.5' branched whip \$40</p>	<p><b>Zone: 3 / Height: 13' / Spread: 10' / Shape:</b> Rounded <b>Summer Foliage:</b> Dark green / <b>Fall Foliage:</b> Red yellow / <b>Flower:</b> White Large bright red eating or cooking cherries. Very juicy, small pits. Self-pollinating. Very hardy. Full sun, well-drained soil.</p>
<p>V</p> 	<p><b>Sweetheart Eating Cherry</b> 7.5' - 8.5' branched whip \$45</p>	<p><b>Zone: 5 / Height: 12' / Spread: 10' / Shape:</b> Rounded <b>Summer Foliage:</b> Dark green / <b>Fall Foliage:</b> Red yellow / <b>Flower:</b> White One of the best cherries. Ripens late in the season. Firm, with good flavour. Self-pollinating. Full sun, all types of soils.</p>
<p>W</p> 	<p><b>Bartlett Pear</b> 7.5' - 8.5' tree \$40</p>	<p><b>Zone: 5 / Height: 15' / Spread: 10' / Shape:</b> Compact round <b>Summer Foliage:</b> Dark green / <b>Fall Foliage:</b> Yellow / <b>Flowers:</b> White Bright yellow fruit. Firm flesh, fine flavour and good aroma. Very adaptable to a wide range of soils. Full sun.</p>

<p>X</p> 	<p><b>Ludwig Spaeth Lilac</b> 4' – 5' shrub \$35</p>	<p><b>Zone: 3 / Height: 10' / Spread: 7' / Shape: Upright</b> <b>Summer Foliage:</b> Bluish green / <b>Fall Foliage:</b> Yellow / <b>Flower:</b> Purple Reddish purple flower. Very fragrant, easy to transplant. <b>Soils:</b> Adapts to a wide range of soil conditions, in both dry and moist locations. Best in full sun. Not attractive to deer.</p>
<p>Y</p> 	<p><b>Sensation Lilac</b> 3' – 4' shrub \$35</p>	<p><b>Zone: 3 / Height: 8' / Spread: 8' / Shape: Upright</b> <b>Summer Foliage:</b> Green / <b>Fall Foliage:</b> Yellow <b>Flower:</b> Deep purple, edged with white Beautiful colour, very fragrant. <b>Soils:</b> Adapts to a wide range of soil conditions. Blooms best in full sun. Disease and deer resistant.</p>
<p>Z</p> 	<p><b>Viburnum</b> 4' shrub \$35</p>	<p><b>Zone: 5 / Height: 10' / Spread: 13' / Shape: Rounded</b> <b>Summer Foliage:</b> Dark green / <b>Fall Foliage:</b> Green / <b>Flower:</b> White Leaves are soft yellow green when unfolding. Native plant for sun or shade, very hardy. <b>Soils:</b> Grows well in moist or dry soil.</p>
<p>Z1</p> 	<p><b>Pink Diamond Hydrangea</b> 4' – 5' top-grafted tree \$65</p>	<p><b>Zone: 5 / Height: 7' / Spread: 5' / Shape: Upright</b> <b>Summer Foliage:</b> Green / <b>Fall Foliage:</b> Yellow / <b>Flower:</b> Pink Showy flowers begin a pale green in mid-summer, changing to snowy white and then a deep rich pink in autumn. Shrub grafted to a hardy 3' stem to form a small ornamental tree. Ideal for small areas. Prefers rich, moist soil and flowers well in light shade, even on the north side of a house.</p>
<p>Z2</p> 	<p><b>Flowering Almond Cherry</b> 5.5' – 6.5' top-grafted tree \$65</p>	<p><b>Zone: 3 / Height: 10' / Spread: 7' / Shape: Rounded</b> <b>Summer Foliage:</b> Green / <b>Fall Foliage:</b> Yellow bronze / <b>Flower:</b> Pink Double-flowered almond shrub grafted to a sturdy 4' stem to form a beautiful small ornamental tree. Masses of double pink flowers in spring. <b>Soils:</b> Wide variety from sandy loam to clay, moderately to well-drained. Transplants very easily. Ideal for small areas.</p>
